

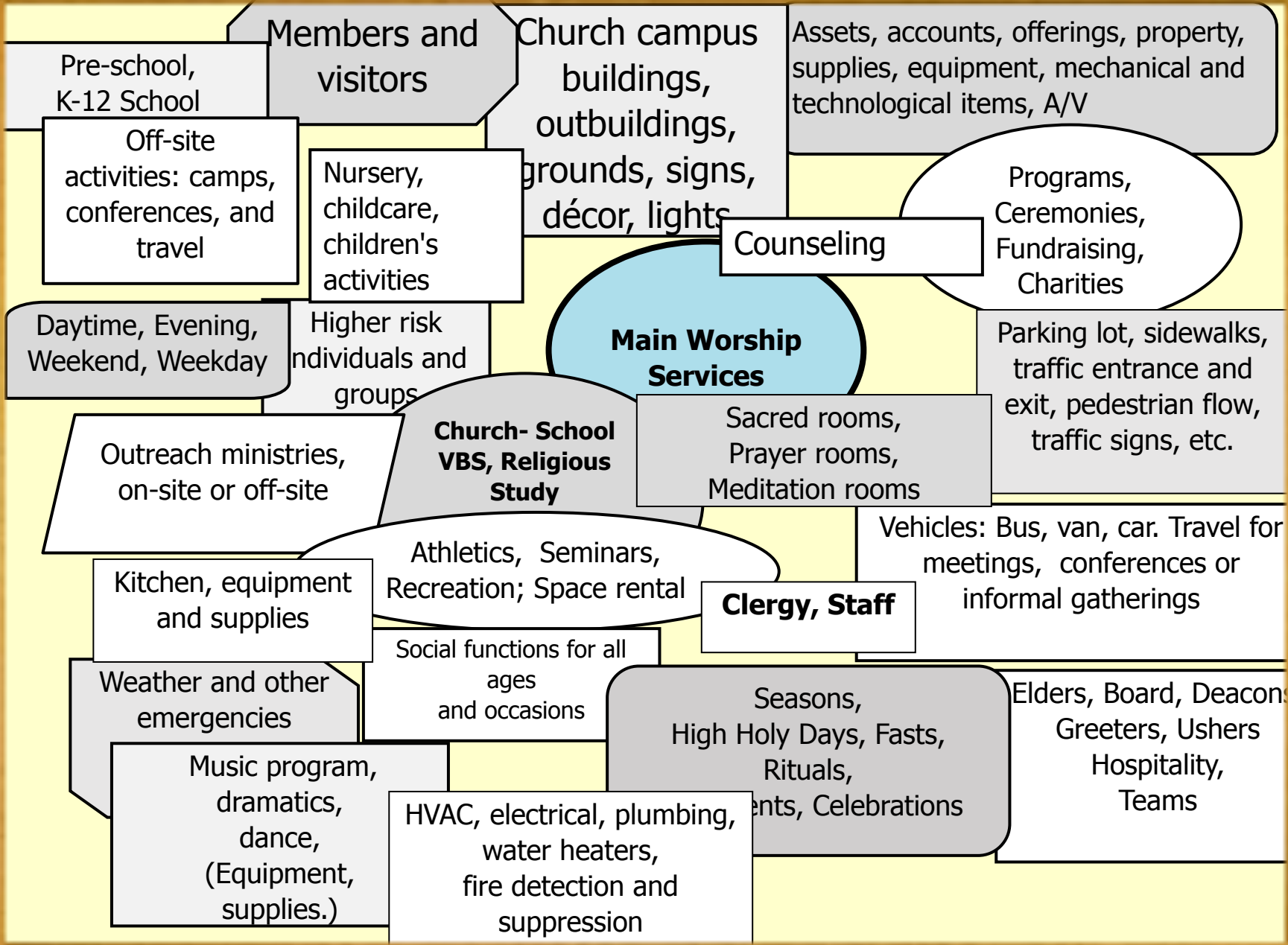

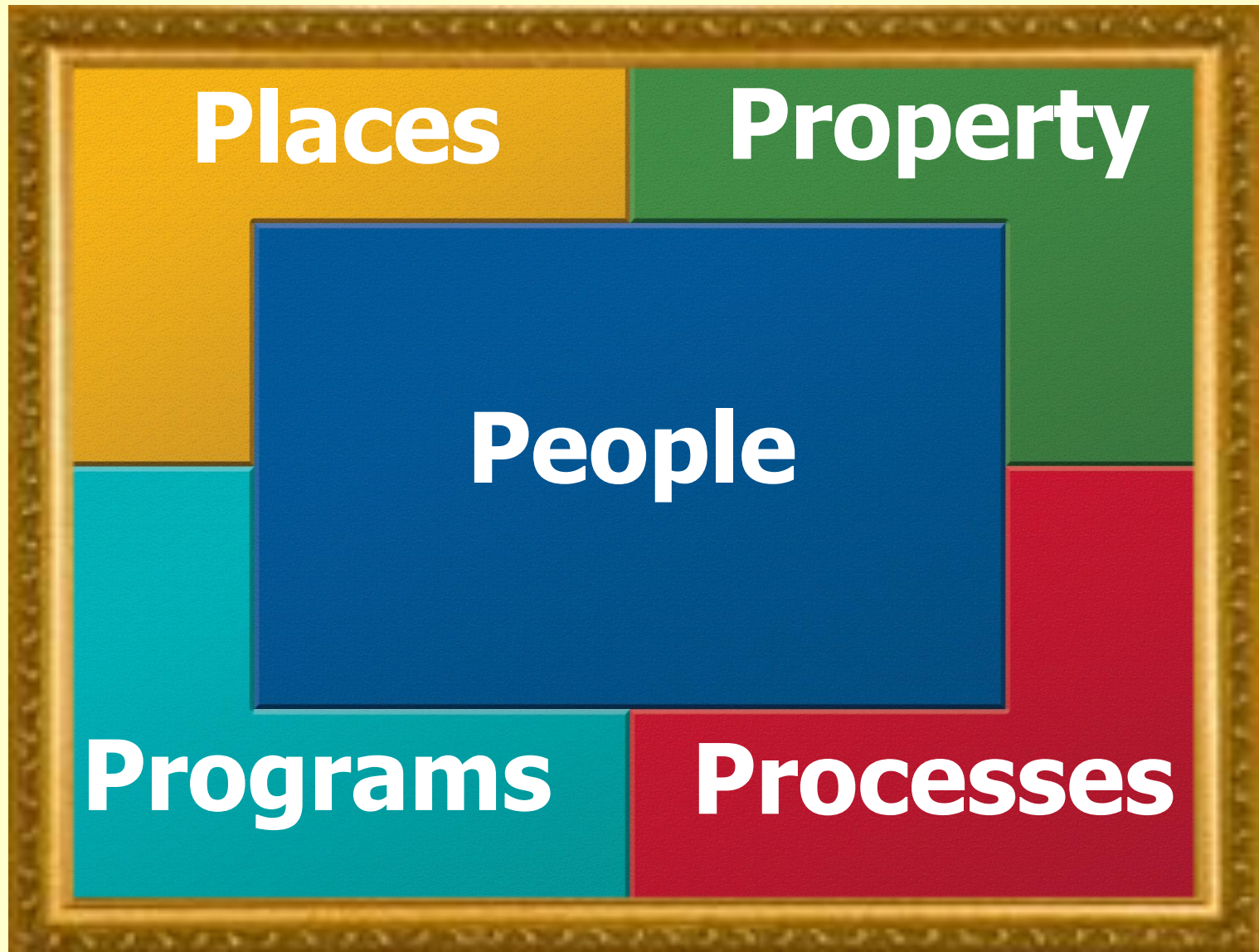

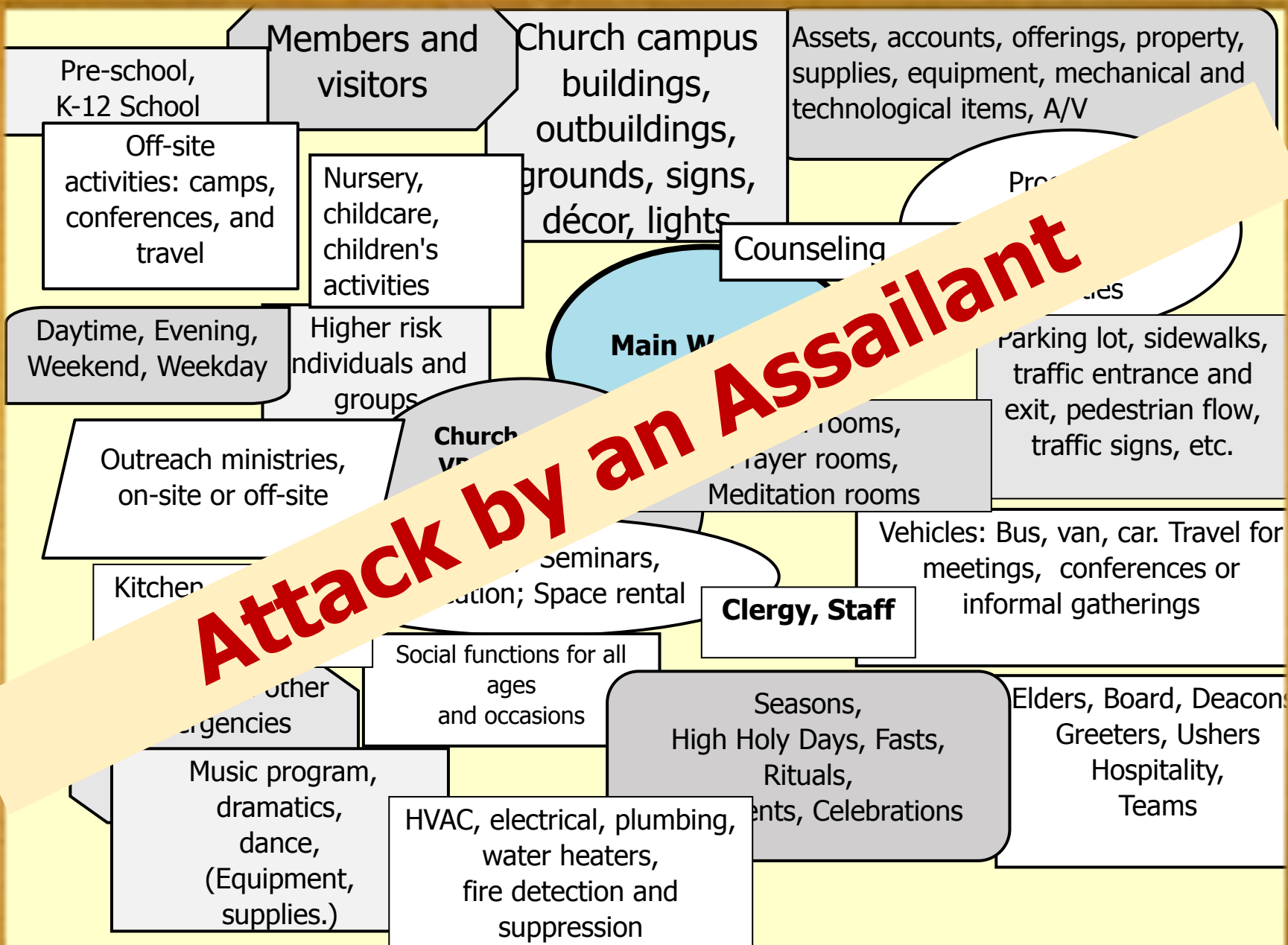
Music program, dramatics, dance, (Equipment, supplies.)

The Assailant's Advantage

**He knows what he is going to do,
and how he is going to do it.**

**He is ready for the attack,
with a weapon close at hand.**





The Assailant's Advantage

When he attacks, he is the only one who is not surprised, shocked and confused.





The Assailant's Advantage

He *wants* people to be hurt or killed.

**He doesn't need to
protect or assist anyone.**

**He isn't disturbed by the
sights or sounds.**





**What advantages
can we take from
an Assailant?**



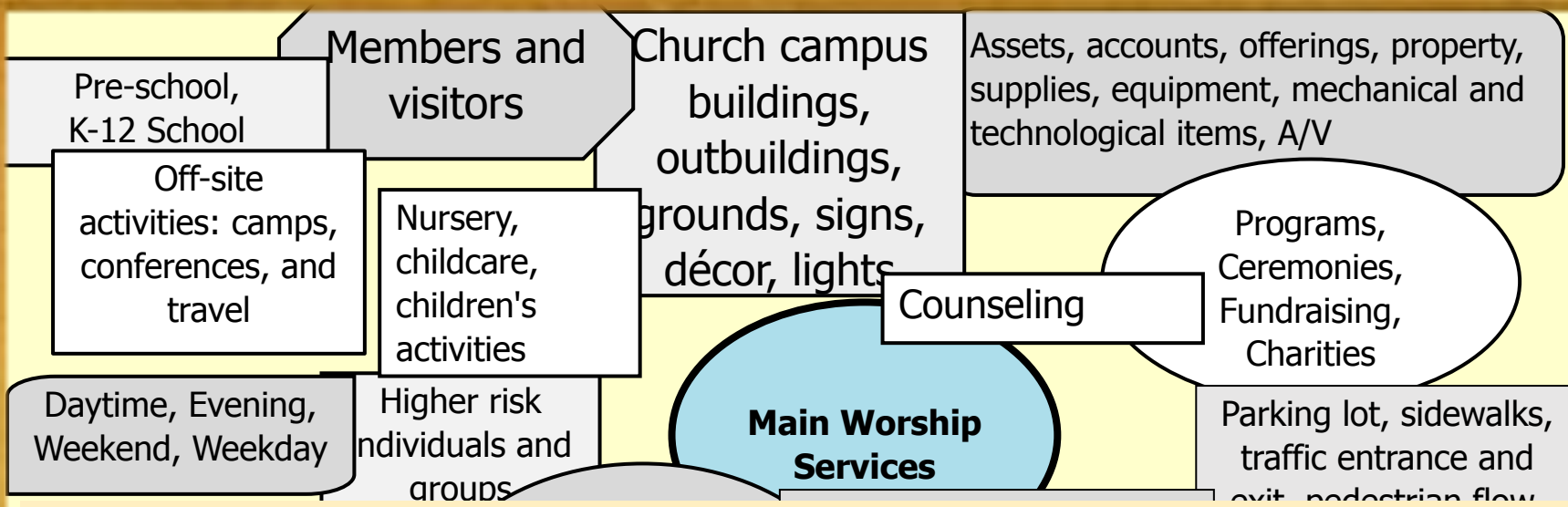
- Take away or limit his ability to easily surveil the exterior and interior of the church.
- Take away his confidence that your church is an easy target.

- Take away his time to prepare outside or in an entry area.
- Take away his ability to find unsecured or unmonitored entry points or hidden areas.

- Take away his ability to enter and blend in without being observed.
 - Take away his opportunities to hide and wait.
- Take away his ability to harm people or property without being detected.

- Take away his access to vulnerable or targeted people, groups, or property.
- Take away his knowledge of who will respond and their exact locations and capabilities.

- Take away his ability to catch everyone off-guard.
- Take away his control of the situation and his ability to sustain his attack.
