DATA GATHERING

Families

61 online survey responses 5 virtual and in-person listening and learning sessions with 26 adults and 36 children

Post-listening and learning session surveys

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Parents and Caregivers

- 98% identified as white or caucasian
 - One identified as a single parent
- Just over 50% reported attending religious services about once a week or several times a week.
- Denominations represented: Episcopalian, Lutheran, Nazarene, UMC, Presbyterian, UCC, Catholic, Mennonite



DATA GATHERING

Faith Leader Demographics

114 online survey responses

4 virtual listening and learning sessions with clergy; 25 total participants

2 virtual listening and learning sessions with school chaplains 55% Christian formation directors (lay or ordained), 10% lead pastors

Congregations ranged in size from less than 50 and more than 200

25% Episcopalian; other denominations represented: Baptist, ECLA, UMC, Nazarene, Interdenominal, and Church of England



DATA GATHERING

Limitations

Skewed towards families somewhat connected to Christian communities (mostly mainline)

Limited sample size

Limited to North America

Listening and learning sessions led by proponents of Godly Play



THEMES: Faith Leaders

- Concern about family commitment and engagement with local faith community
- Anxiety about lack of family participation
- Exhaustion and burnout as they struggle to figure out what families really need.







FAITH LEADERS: Commitment & Engagement

Faith leader concerns regarding families and children:

- Does lack of attendance equate with disinterest
- Decrease in volunteer availability, i.e. Sunday school teachers, youth leaders

"Many young families are too busy with other events on Sunday mornings to attend."

"It's just a seeming lack of interest from our families in participating in the life of the Church."

"Lack of volunteers, lack of space, high turnover of staff."



FAITH LEADERS: Exhaustion, Anxiety, and Burnout


"I don't know what to offer parents and parent's aren't taking the time."

"It is hard to know which projects and activities to put my time and energy into..."

"... we haven't been able to get back into the pre COVID routine or the post COVID practice of coming every week."







"Navigating social media with my soon-to-be preteen."


Stress and time

- Quality time with children • Healing past traumas
- Financial stress
- Mental Health
- Faith shifts
- Overall exhaustion



Families: Felt lack of connection

- Social/ideological isolation
- Caregiver "void"



"No support. No family. No faith community. Few friends."

"Nobody. We have nobody. It's extremely discouraging. I'd love to be part of a faith community that could be a second family."

"Raising 7 children with little physical and emotional support."



FAMILIES: Spiritual and religious questioning


Spiritual Isolation

- Conflicted relationship with religious institutions and spirituality
- Ability to nurture children's spirituality
- Suspicious of provided religious education

"Trying to impart knowledge or answering questions when I am going through my own faith shifts."

"I don't feel very spiritual myself, and don't know how to talk about God with them other than demonstrating gratitude every now and then."





AWAY FORWARD


Families and faith leaders share...






