Bowing and Crossing: A Matter of Personal Preference

People often bow as the processional cross moves by their pew and as they enter and exit their pew. The bow is always made to the tabernacle (behind the little gold door on the high altar, where blessed bread and wine are kept) in recognition of the presence of Jesus. People cross themselves during the opening acclamation, the final blessing, and various moments in between. At the beginning of the Gospel, people will make smaller cross signs using their thumb, on their forehead, lips and heart, as a way of honoring Jesus' words as found in the Gospel and our desire to have them in our heads, on our lips and in our hearts. All bowing and crossing is optional.

Holy Eucharist/Communion

Holy Eucharist, also known as Communion, is open to all of the baptized of all denominations. The Episcopal Church has an open table and your are invited to participate as you feel comfortable. The ushers will direct you forward to receive the sacrament.

To receive the Eucharist, place your right palm over your left and you will be given the Bread; the Wine will be offered and you may guide the chalice to your lips. If you prefer not to drink from it, leave the wafer on your palm and the chalice bearer will dip it in the cup and place it on your mouth. If you wish to receive a Blessing in lieu of Elements, simply cross your arms over chest. Gluten Free communion wafers are available at the Lectern Communion Station. Please tell the clergy member you require GF when you come forward.
