An Event to Say, "Thank You!"--Thanksgiving Eve Gift of A Loaf of Bread

- At the Thanksgiving Eve worship service give each family who attends a loaf of bread from the best bakery near your church.
- Families can sign up at a Sunday service or online on your church's website
- ► Each family receives a loaf of bread to be served at their Thanksgiving dinner or taken to the Thanksgiving dinner they are attending. The priest announces that the bread is a gift from [the name of your church.
- ▶ This becomes a great evangelism tool.
- Bless the bread at the offertory and have the altar guild hand each family a loaf as they leave the service.
- Have a few extra loaves for guests.

Another Event to Say, "Thank you!"

The Legacy Society Recognized on *The Fourth Sunday of Lent - Laetare or Joyful or Refreshment Sunday*

- ► The names of the people who have remembered the church in their estate plans and have given their permission are printed in the Sunday bulletin with a statement of thanks. Some people will wish to remain anonymous. The number of anonymous members can be noted.
- A sheet cake from a great bakery is purchased by the church or by a donation and served at the hospitality hour following the service.
- During the offertory everyone is invited to share in this wonderful celebratory hospitality hour in honor of the members of the Legacy Society.

Another Event to Say, "Thank you!" Sundae Sunday

- One Sunday in the summer provide ice cream sundaes to all who attend, declaring that the church is using this treat to thank them for the work they have done for the ministries of the church.
- This should occur after ALL services! Announcing it on a previous Sunday and/or on the church's website may increase attendance that day.
- ► The priest can announce, "Your parent may have told you not to eat dessert before you've eaten your meal, but I'm suspending this rule today. Enjoy your ice cream!"
- Consider having some "no sugar added" ice cream or water ice for people with special dietary needs.

Personal handwritten notes to say, "Thank you!"

- Writing personal notes is an incredibly effective way to thank people for their efforts in the various ministries of the church.
- And remember No one ever left a church community because they felt thanked and appreciated!
